## **Town Centres and Retail**

#### Introduction

- 1. This paper has been prepared for the Economy and Fair Work Committee to aid Committee members during the first evidence session of the Committee's inquiry into town centres and retail
- 2. The remit of the inquiry is to—

Identify the new realities of retail and ecommerce in Scotland and the resulting impact on town centres. What is the subsequent policy response needed to create living and resilient town centres?

- 3. The Committee launched a call for views on Tuesday 1 February which closed on Wednesday 16 March. Responses to the call for views can be accessed <u>here</u>.
- On 24 March, the Scottish Government published its retail strategy "<u>Getting</u> the Right Change" with the aim of delivering successful, profitable retail businesses, creating of new, better jobs and to become an exemplar for inclusive growth.
