Avian flu in Scotland

- 1. The <u>Cabinet Secretary first wrote to the Committee in relation to the avian flu</u> <u>outbreak on 24 November 2021</u> and the Committee has corresponded with the Scottish Government since then to monitor the situation.
- 2. The <u>Convener wrote to the Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs and Islands on 17</u> <u>November 2022</u>. This follows the increase in the number of cases of avian flu in domestic flocks in recent months; the UK Government's decision, on 7 November 2022, to impose mandatory housing for all poultry and domesticated birds in England; and strong concerns expressed by the NFUS and the Scottish poultry sector over the Scottish Government's decision that similar restrictions are not required in Scotland.
- 3. The Cabinet Secretary responded on 23 November 2022.
- 4. The Committee agreed on 23 November 2022 to invite Scotland's Chief Veterinary Officer, Sheila Voas, to provide an update on the current situation regarding avian flu in Scotland.
- 5. Following the evidence session, the Committee may wish to consider whether it wants to take any additional evidence in relation to avian flu.
