Evidence session with the Scottish Government on the Scottish Budget 2023-2024

Background

- 1. On 22 December 2022, the Scottish Government introduced the <u>Budget (Scotland) (No. 2) Bill</u>. The Budget Bill is how the Parliament agrees public spending in Scotland and is introduced to the Parliament every year ahead of the new financial year starting in April.
- 2. In addition to the Bill, the <u>Scottish Government published its 2023-24 draft Scottish Budget on 15 December</u>, which sets out in more detail the Scottish Government's spending plans for the coming year. Also included in the <u>supporting documentation</u> for the Budget is a 'Level 4' data spreadsheet, providing a further breakdown of expenditure on matters within the remit of the Cabinet Secretary for Net Zero, Energy and Transport. <u>All documents pertaining to the budget for 23-24 can be found on the Scottish Government's website.</u>

Pre-budget scrutiny by the NZET Committee

- 3. Subject committees such as the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee normally undertake pre-budget scrutiny each year on matters within its remit. The aim of this is to inform the Scottish Government's thinking around the preparation of its Budget.
- 4. On 10 November 2022, the Committee wrote to the Scottish Government setting out a number of conclusions and recommendations from its pre-budget scrutiny. The Committee's pre-budget scrutiny letter captured key issues and questions on—
 - The Fair Fares Review and bus travel;
 - Electric vehicle charging point infrastructure;
 - Scottish Government's response to the Committee's report on its energy price rises inquiry;
 - The publication of the final Hydrogen Action Plan and associated capital investment, as well as the anticipated Energy and Just Transition Strategy;
 - The resources of Scotland's environmental regulators.

- 5. The Committee also sought details of the Scottish Government's approach to the Joint Review of Budget as it relates to climate change.
- 6. <u>The Committee received a response from the Scottish Government on 21 December 2022.</u>

Evidence session on 17 January 2023

- 7. On 17 January 2023, the Committee will hold an evidence session with the Cabinet Secretary for Net Zero, Energy and Transport to discuss the Scottish Budget 2023-24.
- 8. The main purpose of the session is to explore the Cabinet Secretary's budgetary priorities within the portfolio for the coming year.
