Visitor Levy (Scotland) Bill

- 1. The purpose of this paper is to provide information to inform the Committee's final evidence sessions as part of its Stage 1 scrutiny of the Visitor Levy (Scotland) Bill ("the Bill").
- 2. At this meeting, the Committee will hear from COSLA followed by the Minister for Community Wealth and Public Finance.

Background

- 4. The Bill was introduced on 23 May 2023 and the Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee was designated lead committee for consideration of it at Stage 1 on 14 June. The Bill and its accompanying documents are available online.
- 5. The Bill's Policy Memorandum.¹ states that "the overall policy objective of the Bill is to give a discretionary power to local authorities to introduce a levy on stays in overnight accommodation in all, or part, of their area if they choose to do so."

- 7. The Committee previously took evidence on the Bill from Scottish Government officials in June shortly after its introduction. - 8. The Committee then took evidence from two panels of witnesses representing accommodation providers on 24 October 2023. The meeting papers

- 9. The Committee also took evidence from representatives of local authorities followed by the European Tourism Association (ETOA) on 31 October. The meeting papers and official report can be accessed on the Committee's website: Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee 25th Meeting, 2023 | Scottish Parliament Website
- 10. Most recently, the Committee took evidence from representatives of the Scottish tourism industry on 7 November. The meeting papers and official report are available online: Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee 26th Meeting, 2023 | Scottish Parliament Website
- 11. The Minister <u>wrote to the Committee on 27 October</u> to advise it that the Scottish Government will "seek to give local authorities the power to create a cruise ship levy. More policy work needs to be carried out, including consultation with the cruise industry, but we are open to considering adding a cruise ship levy to the Visitor Levy (Scotland) Bill."

Consideration by other committees

- 12. The Delegated Powers and Law Reform Committee <u>reported on the Bill's delegated powers provisions on 31 October</u>. The report confirms that the DPLR Committee was content with 14 of the 17 delegated powers contained in the Bill but had queries in relation to the remaining three delegated powers.
- 13. The DPLR report further confirms that the Scottish Government has agreed to amend the Bill to—
 - add a requirement to consult local authorities and tourist organisations before amending the lists of accommodation types by adding or removing a type of accommodation or varying the description of a type of accommodation under Section 4;
 - add a requirement to consult local authorities and tourist organisations before specifying any exemptions or rebates under Section 10; and
 - amend section 36 so that the exercise of powers to categorise "involved third parties" in relation to the inspection business premises will be subject to the affirmative procedure.
- 14. The Finance and Public Administration Committee also invited written submissions on the Bill's Financial Memorandum. <u>Five responses</u> were received and the FPA Committee agreed to forward them to the lead Committee as part of its consideration of the Bill and to take no further action.

Call for views and engagement

- 15. The Committee published a call for views on the Bill in June with a deadline for responses of 15 September. Over 370 responses to the formal call for views were received from a broad range of stakeholders and can be accessed on the Committee's website.
