Scottish Football Association: Evidence session

Note by the clerk

Background

- The Scottish Football Association (SFA) is the governing body for football in Scotland, representing its member clubs and affiliated regional associations. The SFA is a member of UEFA and FIFA and holds a position on the International Football Association Board (IFAB), the body that determines the Laws of the Game.
- 2. Founded in 1873, the SFA is one of the oldest national associations in the world with the aim of promoting, fostering, and developing the game at all levels in Scotland.
- 3. In May 2023, the Committee <u>wrote to the Scottish Football Association</u> to express its concerns regarding the changing of the Scottish Cup Final kick-off time from 3pm to 5.30pm, and the disruption caused to fans.
- 4. Following a series of letters exchanged between the Committee and the SFA, Members expressed an interest in holding a one-off evidence session with the SFA, to discuss the above and other issues concerning football in Scotland.
- In June 2023, a <u>fan-led review was commissioned and published</u> by the Scottish Football Supporters Association. The review was headed by a Scottish Football Alliance working group, comprised of supporters, players, coaches, officials, and club representatives, led by Henry McLeish.
- 6. The Committee has also expressed an interest in exploring wider issues in Scottish football at this meeting such as governance, Project Brave, child wellbeing, youth development, facilities, and inequalities.
