Poverty and Inequality Commission Review Report

Clerk's Note

- The Poverty and Inequality Commission (the Commission) provides independent advice and scrutiny to Scottish Ministers on poverty and inequality. The chair of the Commission and three of its members resigned during a re-appointment process that began in mid-2023.
- 2. This paper sets out the background to the in-private evidence session with John Somers, the Scottish Government official who undertook a review of the circumstances that led to the resignations from the Commission.
- 3. Shirley-Anne Somerville, Cabinet Secretary for Social Justice (the Cabinet Secretary), wrote to the Committee on 25 January 2024 stating that the Scottish Government had accepted the Poverty and Inequality Commission Resignation Review Report recommendations on its part and that a Revised Framework Document was published last year.
- 4. Under the Child Poverty (Scotland) Act 2017, the Parliament has a role in approving the Scottish Government's nominees for appointment to the Commission. In the coming months the Committee will report to the Parliament on the nominees for appointment.
- 5. On <u>8 February 2024</u>, the Committee agreed to hold an in-private evidence session on the Review Report with the reviewer. The Committee wrote to the Cabinet Secretary on <u>19 February 2024</u>, saying it was keen to hear from the reviewer in advance of its consideration of the Scottish Government's nominees for appointment to the Commission.
